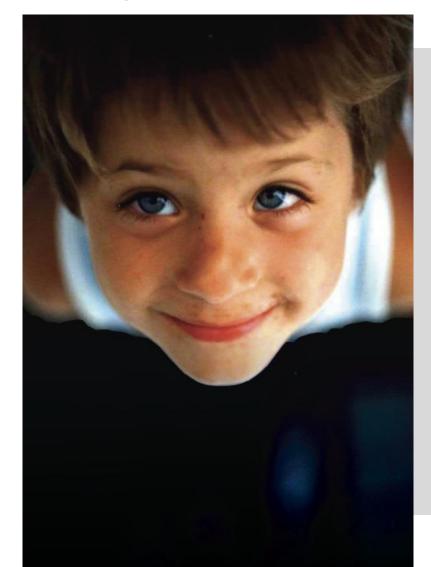








Andreas Yannopoulos our 10-year-old founder

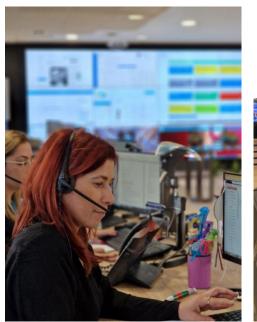

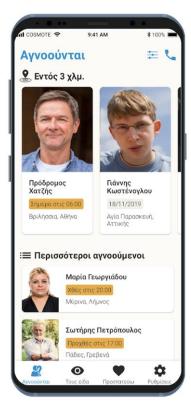

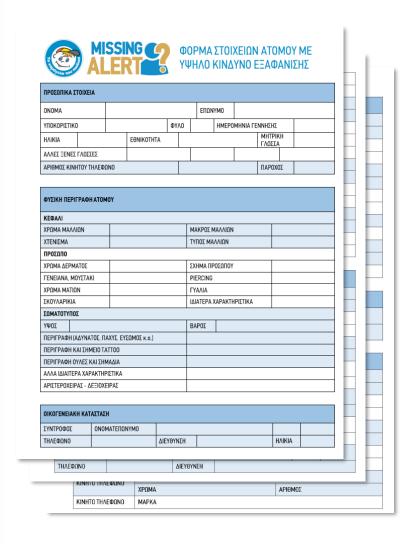

Immediately, and as part of the SmileNet Program, a tracking service will also be provided for individuals at high risk of disappearance



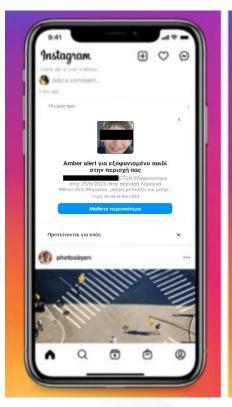

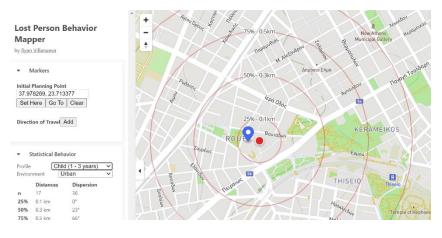








Lost Person Behavior Mapper applications Probability of Detection missing person profile assessment - behavioral models | Drones







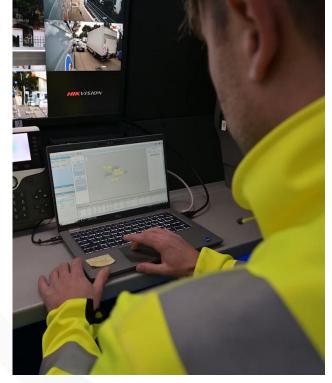

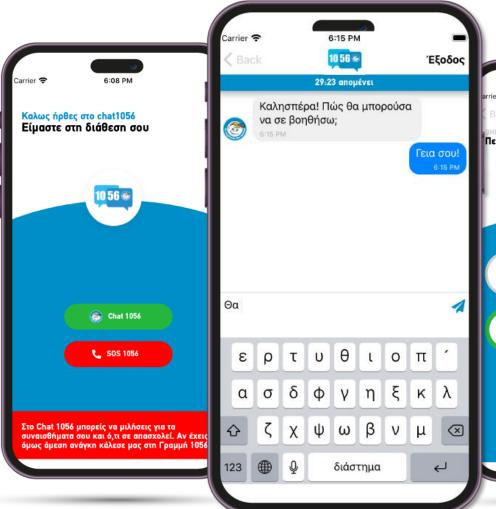


"The Smile of the Child" has launched in Greece NCMEC's CyberTipline, which serves as the central reporting system for online child exploitation. It provides the possibility to report suspicious online activities involving children.

Only in 2022, the application of the U.S. Cybertipline received 43.345 reports of material related to child sexual exploitation for Greece, while in 2023, 24.985 reports related to Greece.

"Thanasis Makris" Search and Rescue Team is consisted of volunteers who are trained according to the latest guidelines and protocols of recognized international organizations and by certified trainers. In SAR Team there are also dogs who are trained, taking advantage of their olfactory ability in tracking ,trailing air and scenting.

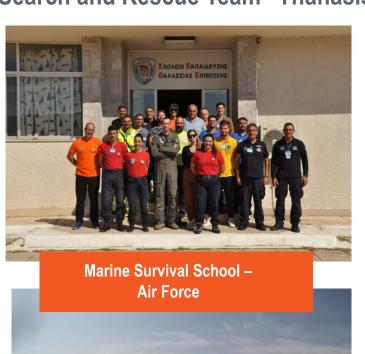


"Thanasis Makris" Search and Rescue Team scope is:

- the assistance for both in missing persons search operations in urban and non-urban environments, but also after natural or technological disasters, primarily to locate and rescue people who are injured, trapped, missing, missing, disappeared or victims of abduction or trafficking, but also for social support,
- the assistance and support of the actions of the General Secretariat for Civil Protection of Greece and other respective bodies in any case of prevention, response and rehabilitation - before, during and after a disaster or other emergency.
